

Announcement of Pibulsongkram Rajabhat University Issue Policy against taking gifts or gratuities as compensation for providing services in 2025 (No Gift Policy 2025)

On behalf of Pibulsongkram Rajabhat University, the university firmly intends to oppose all forms of corruption. This includes strengthening morality, ethics, and values of honesty in performing duties by creating an organizational culture of morality and transparency for the university. Under the regulations of the government that emphasizes the importance of combating acts of corruption and misconduct, which has been specified in the master plan under the national strategy against corruption, on the issue of anti-corruption and misconduct, Phase 2 (2023 - 2027). Therefore, a policy has been established for government agencies to set guidelines to prohibit all government officials from receiving all kinds of gifts and gratuities from the performance of their duties (No Gift Policy 2024).

According to Article 31 of Rajabhat University Act B.E. 2547 (2007), Constitution of the Kingdom of Thailand, B.E. 2560 (2017), and Section 128 of the Constitutional Act Concerning the Prevention and Suppression of Corruption, B.E. 2561 (2018), prohibited any government official from receiving property or any other unlawful benefit that may be calculated as extra income of government official from anyone. In addition to property or benefits that should be obtained according to law, rules, or regulations, the announcement is hereby announced as follows.

- 1. Do not seek to obtain gifts, presents, or any other unlawful benefits.
- 2. Do not give or receive property or any other benefits as a result of performing duties.
- 3. Do not consent or connive with family members giving or receiving gifts or any other benefits as a result of performing or unlawful benefits.
- 4. In cases of necessity, give or receive property or any other benefits according to ethics or customs. Government officials must comply with the regulations of the Office of the Prime Minister regarding giving or receiving gifts by government officials, B.E. 2565 (2022), including the announcement of the National Anti-Corruption Commission regarding the criteria for receiving property or other benefits through the ethics of public officials, B.E. 2562 (2020)

In this regard, university request that the administrators and personnel of Pibulsongkram Rajabhat University strictly adhere to this announcement.
